16 WARSHIPS ARRIVING HERE

3 Are Canadian, Remainder Ours

Seven big U.S. warships arrive at Pearl Harbor today. They are coming from the Mainland and will continue on to the Far East to provide added muscle for Navy squadrons there.

THE SHIPS arriving today will be joined tomorrow by nine other U.S. and Canadian vessels, making it a busy two days at Pearl Harbor. In all there are more than 5,000 men aboard the 16 ships.

Arriving early this morning will be the attack transport Okanogan, the deck landing ship Point Defiance and destroyers Somers, Rowan, Gurke and Southernland of destroyer division 51.

DUE AT noon is the attack cargo ship Matthews.

Commanding officers of the vessels are Matthews, Capt. G. B. Williams; Okanogan, Capt. R. E. Cutts; Somers, Cmdr. E. J. Cummings Jr.;

Rowan, Cmdr. C. G. Perry Jr.; Gurke, Cmdr. S. T. Edgerton Jr.; Southernland, Cmdr. C. Grizovic; and Point Defiance, Cmdr. J. H. Bowell. The Canadian vessels arriving tomorrow are the escort destroyers Saguney, Otawa and St. Laurent.

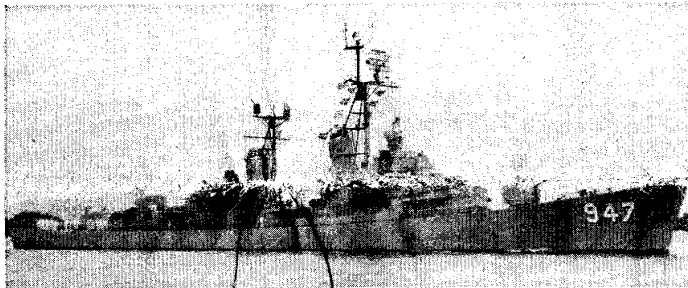
STEAMING IN with them will be amphibious squadron seven composed of the attack transports Cavalier, Navarro and Talladega, the attack cargo ship Merrick, and the dock landing ships Belle Grove and Cavido. The Canadians will visit here about two weeks.

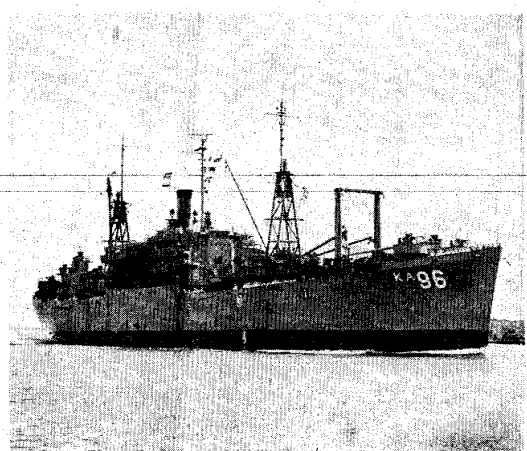
