
A large percentage of America doesn't know of or care about Normandy.


Titled The Fallen 9000, the piece is meant as a visual reminder of those who died during the D-Day beach landings at Normandy on June 6th, 1944 during WWII.


The original team consisted of 60 volunteers, but as word spread nearly 500 additional local residents arrived to help with the temporary installation that lasted only a few hours before being washed away by the tide 9,000 Fallen Soldiers Etched into the Sand on Normandy Beach to Commemorate Peace Day.
